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BIRTH—AGE 3 YEARS



Early Childhood Intervention (ECI) is a statewide program for families with children, birth to three years of age, with disabilities and developmental delays. ECI supports families to help children reach their potential through developmental services. Services are provided by a variety of local agencies and organizations across Texas.

3 YEARS—21 YEARS



Child Find is a free referral and information service that helps connect children with learning challenges to school-based support programs.

School districts and charter schools provide special education and related services to students with disabilities. When contacting your child's local school, you will be connected with a professional who is most qualified to evaluate the educational needs of your child, and who can assist in determining if a disability is present.
